## A BRIEF REPORT

Considering the large number of fire accidents in and around Ankola, the Youth Red Cross unit of G.C.college thought of organizing a workshop on Fire Safety for the students of the college and nearby public. The main objective of the workshop was to create awareness about fire safety procedures and protocols to be followed during outbreak of fires. With safety as its priority the Youth Red cross unit organized a workshop on Fire safety on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of December for which Shri Umesh Naik and his team of fire fighters of Fire Station Ankola were the resource persons.

The function started with the invocation song and welcome of the team. Shri Umesh Naik Fire station master spoke on the occasion. He spoke on various way outbreaks of fire takes place and also emphasized on the main sources of fire. He also demonstrated the usage of fire extinguishers available in the college campus. Dr Ashokkumar Principal of the college in his presidential remarks asked the students to make use of the workshop and pass on the information to their friends and relatives. Dr Nanjundiah proposed the vote of thanks to the whole team.

After the talk the Shri Umesh Naik along with his team of fire safety personnel moved towards the ground for demonstration of dozing out fires. First the team demonstrated the procedures of putting of small fires using available resources at hand. Some students were also asked to volunteer themselves and put out the fire using safety precautions.

Later the team of fire fighters demonstrated the way in which they put out big fire outbreaks using the water hoozes mounted on the Fire extinguisher vehicle. They showed the different types of pipes used and the various ways the water pressure is used to put out fire.

After the demonstration Dr Ashwin.R thanked and conveyed this gratitude to the team of Fire fighters. Around 108 students and nearly 20 shopkeepers from nearby area attended and made use of the workshop.
