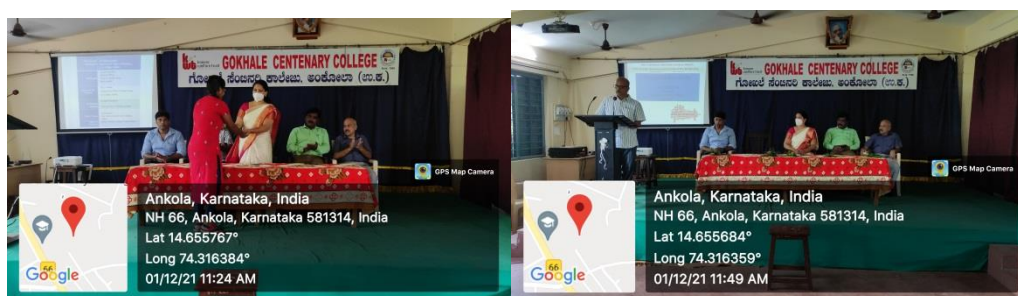
WORLD AIDS DAY

Every year, on 1 December, the world commemorates World AIDS Day. People around the world unite to show support for people living with and affected by HIV and to remember those who lost their lives to AIDS.

This World AIDS Day, UNAIDS is highlighting the urgent need to end the inequalities that drive AIDS and other pandemics around the world.

Forty years since the first AIDS cases were reported, HIV still threatens the world. Today, the world is off track from delivering on the shared commitment to end AIDS by 2030 not because of a lack of knowledge or tools to beat AIDS, but because of structural inequalities that obstruct proven solutions to HIV prevention and treatment.

Aids can be prevented and also controlled by understanding the causes and the underlying treatment for the same. The teenage group being one of the majority section of the society being affected by this dreaded disease the Youth Red Cross, Dept of Physical Education and Sports in association with Primary Health care center, Belse Ankola, planned to sensitize our college students on the topic of AIDS and hence organized a talk on AIDS.



On the 1ST of December 2021, the workshop was formally inaugurated by lighting the traditional lamp. Dr. Archana Naik, Medical Officer, Primary Health Care Center, Belse Ankola was the Chief guest of the function. She spoke on the basics of Aids which included the various ways the Disease is transmitted, how the students can prevent themselves from AIDS and also about the treatment available at present. She also informed the students about various schemes run by the Government for patients who are HIV positive, and also asked the students to be sensitive towards AIDS patients if they have anyone around them.

Dr. S.V. Vastrad, Professor, Dept of Political Science gave his views on the occasion and spoke on the role of students in having an unbiased attitude towards the HIV positive patients. Dr. Ashok Kumar, Principal of the College addressed the gathering. He informed the audience about the purpose of this talk and advised everyone to make the best use of the opportunity and be a part of various activities in the college.

Dr. Ashwin.R Physical Education Director and Organizer of the function rendered the vote of thanks for the inaugural session. Around 87 students including staff and public participated in the talk.
